Gift of the Priesthood

I love being a priest. *To be a priest is to be given a precious gift and invited to serve people and work for the greater glory of God in a special way. I realize that such convictions may strike some as inconceivable in today's world, but they are true for me and for so many men who have chosen to minister as priests in the Catholic Church. It is by the grace of God, not because I have earned or merited such a vocation. When I review my life as a priest over the past 40 years, I see the evidence of grace and freedom only given by Our Lord to shepherd his people.*

Participation in the priesthood of the New Covenant (or ministerial priesthood) also involves offering the Sacrifice of the Mass, as well as administering the other Sacraments instituted by Our Lord. Have you ever stopped to think where we would be without the priesthood? There would obviously be no Eucharist, no forgiveness of sins in Confession and no Anointing of the Sick. Without the priesthood there would be no Confirmation, thus limiting the growth of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There would also be no bishops or pope to guide the Church. The priesthood allows Jesus to continue working in His Church for when a priest administers any one of the Sacraments, it is actually Christ Who is performing the action (CCC 1120).

From the beginning, the followers of Jesus Christ have responded to the Lord's command to "go...and make disciples" by proclaiming the Gospel message throughout the world. "Catechesis is the word used to describe this essential ministry of the Church through which the teachings of Christ have been passed on to believers throughout the ages" (National Directory for Catechesis, 1).

As pastor 15 years here at St. Timothy's I find great joy in the community of the parish and the school. As the school provides an education rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ; it complements Jesus' teachings and guides the students on the path of Catholic doctrines, and values, prepares each student for a life of faith, service and integrity.

I thank God also for good, committed and responsible parents here at St. Timothy's. *The Catholic School, however good, is complementary to the parents and the home. It is the duty of parents to impart knowledge of the Faith and to make a purposeful effort to teach their children how to really live out that faith.*

Parents, please continue to accompany your children to Mass. Pray frequently with them and help them to be sincere in prayer. Make the home a place of security and love.

Exploring New and seeking out

Academically, the 2013-2014 school year blended new programs and distinguished teaching to meet the individual learning styles of students. The Terra Nova scores reflect the success of this merger. Additionally, St. Timothy Catholic School became a certified X-STEM school.

As an X-STEM school, St. Timothy School partners with USA Science and Engineering Festival to promote student interest in science, technology, engineering, and math activities. Middle School students on the robotics team serve as school-wide ambassadors and support in-house STEM activities.

This school year saw the launch of Lab Learner, a hands-on, no textbook, lab-driven science program for grades K-8. Lead teachers found Lab Learner to be a well-coordinated science program. It enhances our primary and intermediate science programs by providing the opportunity for weekly science labs. The labs require higher-level reading, measurement, and math skills that challenge students. The program provides professional



grade science equipment for student use. In addition, lead teachers have access to professional scientists as back up for science questions.

This year, teachers across the grade levels set strategic goals in math. Teachers combined quality-teaching methods in the classroom with Moby Max, an online program that helps teachers create an individualized education plan for each student. Provided with a fully individualized program, each student is able to practice math skills at his or her own level and at his or her own pace. As a result, the students achieved higher levels, as evidenced by the Terra Nova scores.

With STEM initiatives established and solid gains in math, the academic focus for 2014-2014 is in Language Arts with the introduction of the 6 Traits + 1 writing model. The 6 Traits + 1 model was developed almost 30 years ago. Research shows that this method of teaching writing can significantly raise the level of student writing achievement on standardized tests. Piloting the program during the 4th quarter, the first grade and middle school teachers are excited to report a measurable change in student performance and attitude toward writing.




- *Every STS student who took the Algebra & Geometry Placement Exams passed!*
- *The overall average for STS students for the Algebra exam was 87%. This was 10% higher than the diocesan average and 29% higher than the non-diocesan average.*
- *The overall average for STS students on the Geometry Placement exam was 92%! This year our Terra Nova Math Scores increased significantly across the board; an 8% average increase for students in grades 3 through 7.*
- *Please note that 8th grade students do not take the Terra Nova exam. Fifth Grade alone saw a 19% increase over last year!*

The six traits, including idea, organization, word choice, sentence fluency, voice and convention, are the traits that teachers, writers and readers all agree are important in good writing. In the classroom, teachers weave the six traits into the standard writing process. Mentor texts are used as models of good writing. Teachers and students collaborate during the writing process and students create original works. Rubrics are used to define expectations and standardize grading.

Good writing skills, like good reading skills, help in all content areas. Students write to show not only what they have learned, but also to apply what they have learned. Showing deeper understanding and higher order thinking. Good writing requires creative and critical thinking skills, and developing these skills in students is paramount.

Teachers who are dedicated to student success, combined with cutting-edge technology and solid, substantial resources create an exceptional educational experience for students. The mission at St. Timothy Catholic School is to provide students with a challenging and rigorous curriculum that prepares them for success at the next level and beyond.

Our dedicated teachers believe in providing students creative opportunities to participate in activities related to the curriculum to make the learning experience more meaningful and enjoyable for everyone.


Our Kindergartners celebrate their 100th day of school playing math games, reading stories and imagining being 100 years old. Kindergartners close out the year in a musical graduation ceremony highlighting Spanish and school songs, poems, and nursery rhymes they have learned throughout the year. The stage is decorated with their masterpieces created during art class.

Presidents' Day finds the first graders dressed up as first ladies and presidents, escorted by secret service agents that bear a striking resemblance to their parents. They parade through the halls of Saint Timothy visiting other classrooms and educating our students about their lives. Their public speaking debut is always greeted with enthusiasm and encouragement by the upper grades. Come the month of May, the second graders makes their First Holy Communion, the following Friday at the school Mass, they come dressed in their First Communion attire and participate in a special breakfast for their parents concluded with the May Crowning.

After spending the year studying the good ole' USA and the nifty fifty United States, the third graders perform in an inspirational patriotic Americana Assembly with songs and trivia for the entire school. This special day is celebrated with an out-of-uniform occasion for the third grade to dress in red, white and blue, naturally.

Fourth graders take part in Colonial Day, students dress in colonial costumes for the day, are treated to a visit from a Colonial Soldier, and are immersed in authentic colonial era activities including calligraphy, wax stamping, nail and copper art, corn husk dolls, and an excavation dig in the Science Lab. The students learn the Virginia Reel in P.E. classes leading up to the big day which is then performed for the parents and teachers. Traditional colonial fare is served for lunch on blankets on the school grounds.

A study of Mexico for our fifth graders brings a Cinco de Mayo Day where they perform the Mexican Hat dance, sing Mexican songs, create Mexican crafts including a yarn God's eye, tissue flowers, tie dye t-shirts, and eat a delicious Mexican lunch topped off with fried ice cream.

Kindergarten Graduation



Faith Formation

As a school community, we put our faith into action by receiving the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation. We celebrate our rich Catholic faith through monthly Adoration at the school and the spring tradition of the May Crowning of Mary. Our students learn from their first days at St. Timothy that it doesn't matter how little you are, everyone is called to make a difference. At STS we help our students find concrete ways to put their faith into action on a daily basis. We live our faith by tending to the needs of people in our community through our annual Pro-Life Baby Shower held for the Tepeyac Family Center, praying the rosary for 40 Days for Life at an abortion clinic, collecting food for the Saint Vincent DePaul Society food pantry, and sponsoring out of uniform days supporting charity groups.

Mary's Corner was initiated in 2012 in response to our Holy Father's call to make it the "Year of Faith." Mary's Corner consists of three programs designed to unify our St. Timothy's Catholic Community, strengthen our commitment to prayer, and deepen our faith in the Presence of Our Lord in our daily lives. These programs are the The Pilgrim Virgin Statue Visitation Program, The Family Rosary and Prayer Requests.

The Pilgrim Virgin Statue Visitation Program

Brief History: The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima was

sculpted in 1947 by Jose Thedim, based on the description of Sr. Lucia, one of the three young seers who saw Our Lady each month from May to October 1917 in Fatima, Portugal. Sent out to bring the Message of Fatima to the world, the International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has traveled the world many times, visiting more than 100 countries, including Russia and Red China, bringing the great message of hope, "the peace plan from heaven," to millions of people. Many miracles and signal graces are reported wherever the statue travels including shedding tears on many occasions.

Spotlight on **Alexa McCarthy** (STS 2005, PVI 2009) Alexa McCarthy graduated from UNC Wilmington in 2013, where she majored in Business Administration with a concentration in Marketing and a minor in English. She also received a Professional Writing Certificate and graduated magna cum laude.

Alexa says, "I can confidently say that my Catholic education has been a major factor in shaping me into the person that I am today. Being educated in a manner that incorporated religion on a daily basis truly helps drive home the importance of performing the will of God by service unto others. A major lesson that I learned through my many years in Catholic school is the importance of the way one treats others that can do nothing for them. I have come to find this to be a true judge of character in others. I believe that learning this has helped me develop a willingness to put others before myself, which is something that has helped me get into the position that I currently have in life, not just with my career, but in my relationships with my family, my friends, and with God. This skill is something that I originally learned from my mother and was then further instilled and encouraged at school.
